### Year 8 Personal Development Week, Aberdyfi

Trip code: 25-ZABER

We are pleased to announce that in January 2026 all Year 8 students will be taking part in an exciting week at the Outward Bound Centre at Aberdyfi on the west coast of Wales. This annual trip follows the school tradition for all Year 8 students to participate.



**Forms A, C, H, M will go on 12th January. Forms S, W will go on 19th January.**

The students will travel to the centre by coach, leaving school early on Monday morning and returning on Friday evening.

During the programme, students will take part in activities designed to develop personal skills that cannot easily be learnt in the classroom. Your daughter will be working in a group of 10 - 12 girls under the guidance of one or more qualified instructors. Through a range of land and water-based activities, students will be given opportunities to build self-awareness and confidence. They will be able to set themselves personal challenges, as well as develop mutual trust and support in their groups. Team building and problem-solving activities will encourage both self-reliance and the awareness of other people's needs.

The accommodation is purpose built, well equipped and comfortable. Students will need to bring comfortable, old clothes that can get muddy, but all appropriate specialist clothing and footwear such as waterproofs and boots will be provided. Outward Bound Centres comply with the highest possible safety standards for outdoor activities and activities are carefully structured so that they are suitable for all abilities.

You may be thinking that this all seems very challenging for a Year 8 student, but this trip has been part of our personal development programme for so long because it really does develop our students' independence by

safely encouraging them out of their comfort zones. And they will never be forced to do anything. Here are some comments from this year's cohort:

'I have realised that I can do so much more than I thought I could'

'I learned that I can be a leader.' 'I can put my mind to anything.'

'I loved the gorge walking as we worked really well as a team to support each other and sliding down the waterfall was so fun!'

'I enjoyed the hike and cabin the most because our group worked so well together, the views were amazing and it was really fun sharing the cabin with everyone and making new @friends.'

'The jetty jump was so good, as I have never had the chance to do anything like this.'

The total cost of this trip is £534 and includes **accommodation, meals, activities, insurance, administration costs and travel**. In line with our charging policy, the cost for the board and lodging is £400. The remaining balance we would ask for as a voluntary contribution, but please note, without enough contributions, the visit will not be able to run.

If you would like your daughter to take part in the trip, please make the first payment of **£200** by **Monday 5 May** (you can pay the full sum at this stage if you wish).

You may prefer to pay the balance in instalments; payments are made using ParentMail. You can choose to break these payments up into smaller/ bigger amounts. As long as the amounts shown below are paid by the dates shown below you will not have a late payment. The final date for all payments is **2 December**; payments made using ParentMail will give consent for the trip.

In addition to the initial deposit of £200, the instalment payment dates are:

We would not want anyone to be unable to take part because of financial circumstances. All medication brought on trips should be accompanied by the trip [medication form](#), which should be completed and emailed to Matron at least 2 weeks before the trip. **Medicines must be handed in to the trip leader in their original packaging with the information leaflet and the dispensing label attached.**

As with all trips, we want students and staff to have an enjoyable experience. If either you or the school have any concerns about your daughter's ability to participate then it is vital that we discuss at an early stage how the school can appropriately support her and ensure the trip is suitable for her.
