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Dear Parent/Carer

Year 8 - Human Papillomavirus (HPV) routine immunisation programme

The Buckinghamshire Immunisation Service will be visiting your child's school to offer the HPV vaccination to both boys and girls aged 12 – 13 years old (School Year 8) as part of the National Childhood Immunisation Schedule.

This is now a single dose programme that if received between the ages of 12 - 13years provides up to 87% protection against HPV related cancers and 97% against pre-cancerous cells.

Consent for vaccinations

This year all completed consent forms (yes or no consents) will be entered into a prize draw for the opportunity to win a £75 Amazon voucher.

We will be visiting your child's School Aylesbury High School on **5th July 2024**.

Please complete the electronic consent form (**one for each child**) via [HPV Vaccination Consent Form \(buckchildimmunisations.co.uk\)](http://buckchildimmunisations.co.uk) or the QR Code above and insert your school's unique code: EE136846

This form must be submitted by 9am, one full school day before your session to ensure your child receives their vaccinations on the day. If you consent after this date your child may not be able to receive their immunisations on the day and a link will be sent to you offering an appointment at one of our catch-up clinics based in Aylesbury, Amersham and Wycombe.

We record vaccine refusals from young people and parents to ensure health records are up to date. If you decide that you do not wish for your child to be vaccinated, please select NO consent, giving the reason. This will help us plan and improve the service.

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If at any time you wish to change your consent, you must inform us via email on bht.bucksimmsconsentwithdrawal@nhs.net stating your child's name, date of birth and school before the date of the school session. Please ensure that your child is aware that consent has changed.

8 weeks	Diphtheria, Tetanus, Polio, Pertussis/Hib dose 1
12 weeks	Diphtheria, Tetanus, Polio, Pertussis/Hib dose 2
16 weeks	Diphtheria, Tetanus, Polio, Pertussis/Hib dose 3
1 year	Measles Mumps Rubella (MMR) dose 1
3 years 4 months	Diphtheria, Tetanus, Polio, Pertussis/Hib dose 4 Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) dose 2
2-18 years	Flu vaccine
12-13 years	Human Papillomavirus (HPV) single dose
13-14 years	Diphtheria, Tetanus, Polio, Meningitis ACWY (MenACWY)

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
