This outlines how AHS supports students to build the skills and knowledge to make informed decisions and successful applications for their chosen pathways.

Year 8	-Aberdyfi experience -L4L citizenship lessons on mock trials and the legal system with its different roles and careers -Introduction to apprenticeships talk [*]
Year 9	 -L4L lessons on how to pick their GCSE subjects and future academic choices -GCSE Options Fair and Evening -PSHE sessions with independent Careers Advisor -Assembly from alternative provider of KS4 opportunities* -Visit to Bucks Skills Show -Enterprise/Careers Activity day
Year 10	 -L4L lessons on job search, CV building and interview skills -AHS Community Careers Event -Morrisby testing and feedback offered (optional) -Careers questionnaire to identify groups for careers interviews and 1:1 meetings with independent Careers Adviser -Post 16 Options Assembly with Independent Careers Advisor -Information Evening for parents/carers includes information about careers/destinations -Talk on relevant career opportunities*
Year 11	 -L4L lessons on future choices and taster sessions for subjects without a GCSE equivalent -Group and individual interviews about post 16 options and next steps from independent Careers Advisor -Individual meeting with SLT regarding options and future plans -Sixth Form Information Evening -Subject Ambassadors deliver talks during form time about A Level subjects -Assembly from alternative provider of post-16 opportunities* -Competitive courses and universities information meeting for students and parents/carers

Year 12	 -Unifrog used to support HE and apprenticeship research and for students to build up application materials, including fortnightly guided session during form time -Next Steps Evening (information fair with wide range of universities, talks on higher education and apprenticeships) -Work experience - three day placement in summer term -Personal Development lessons fortnightly, include next steps topics -Degree apprenticeships - provider visit* -Future Success Day (applying to university or for an apprenticeship, personal statements, interview skills) -Medicine and Dentistry information evening for students and parents plus ongoing support for applicants (with separate Google Classroom) -Oxbridge application information evening for students and parents plus ongoing support for applicants (with separate Google Classroom) -Next steps resources shared via Year 12 Google Classroom - Post 18 options assembly and how to start to research options with Independent Careers Advisor -Interviews offered with Independent Careers Advisor -Group and individual support as needed from Next Steps and Careers Lead
Year 13	 -Mock interviews for university applicants -MMI practice session -Interviews offered with independent Careers Advisor -Group and individual support as needed from Next Steps and Careers Lead -Extended Tutor Period fortnightly to work on applications for higher education and/or apprenticeships -Next steps resources shared via Year 13 Google Classroom -Degree apprenticeships - provider visit*
